of I do hereby Acknowledge, do hereby give, grant, sell and convey
unto the said Eunice Garman a Tract of Land situate in Deer Isle
aforesaid bounded as follows on the Southwest by the Northwest Mar-
shore at low water mark, beginning at Inceptibles Eatons Southwest
Corner running three hundred & Twenty Two Rods by lands late belonging
to said Theophilus & James Eaton then South forty five degrees east
forty one Rods and then South forty five degrees west to north west
harbour first mentioned, Together with all the Priviledges and ap-
portances what soever to the same belonging, or in any wise ap-
portaining To have and to hold, the same to the said Eunice
Garman Heir heirs and assigns, to their use and behoof forever
and I do Covenant with the said Eunice Garman Heir heirs &
assigns that Lawfully seized in fee of the Premises that
they are free of all Incumbrances, that I have good Right to sell,
convey the same to the said Eunice Garman, And that I will war-
rant and defend the same to the said Eunice Garman Heir heirs
and assigns forever, against the Lawfull Claims and Demands of all
Persons.
