

Enacted by the Senate & House of Representatives, in General Court Assembled, & by the Authority of the same, That the said Bartholomy de Gregoire and Maria Theresa de Gregoire his wife, be permitted to take and subscribe the oath of Allegiance to this Commonwealth, before two Justices of the peace, quorum unus, of any County within the same, & thereafter and there after, they & each of them, together with their children, vizt Pierre de Gregoire, Nicholas de Gregoire, & Maria de Gregoire, shall be deemed adjudged & taken to be Citizens of this Commonwealth, & entitled to all the liberties, rights & privileges of natural born Citizens. And be it further Enacted by the Authority aforesaid, That the Justices before whom the said Bartholomy de Gregoire & Maria Theresa de Gregoire his wife may take and subscribe the oath aforesaid, shall make return thereof to the Secretary of this Commonwealth, who shall record the same, in the book ordered to be kept for that Purpose. — In the House of Representatives October 29th 1787.
